

APPROACH



My work explores the dialogue between different materials, such as raw wood and flowing textiles. I play with contrasts of texture, density, and mobility to create tension and harmony. Assembly, layering, and spatial organization are at the heart of my approach, which seeks to reveal both what is visible and what remains partially hidden. This approach is expressed through my constructions, drawings, or short films, in a constant search for rhythm and balance.

VARIATIONS

From a single theme, I strive to reveal all its facets. My approach is based on variation: an idea can transform depending on the medium, material, or technique used.



Each variation becomes a new reading of the same theme. By changing the medium, I aim to show how an idea can evolve, reinvent itself, and take on a different dimension depending on perspective and material.

I combine different practices – drawing, collage, painting, digital work, or textiles – to play with textures, layering, and contrasts. This diversity fuels my creativity and enriches my artistic research.



ASSEMBLY

Assembly occupies a central place in my artistic approach. It allows me to connect contrasting materials – wood, textile, paper, metal, or clay – to create works where each element interacts with the others. Through this technique, I explore the tension between visible and hidden, memory and transformation, while adapting this artistic language to various themes such as time, the body, or intimacy.






DRAWING

MATERIAL DIVERSITY

Drawing plays an essential role in my practice because it allows me to express strong emotions through composition, color, and material. Each piece tells a story, mixing tension, fragility, and intensity of feeling.



I experiment with different techniques – charcoal, chalk, paint, ink, or burnt paper – to create visual contrasts and enhance the expressive power of my images. The variety of materials then becomes a means of enriching the narrative and conveying the emotional depth of each scene.




